Pastor's Corner

O Lord, give strength to your people;

give them, O Lord, the blessings of peace. --Psalm 29:11

"Pastor, how is so-and-so doing?"

You might not realize it, but this can be a difficult question for me to answer.

Sometimes I don't know—perhaps I haven't seen that person in a while and don't have an update. If that's the case, I'll say that. Sometimes I do know, and know what I can share, and I will tell you what I can. But sometimes I do know but I can't tell you what I know, because it is (or might be) private. It is better for me to say nothing, or something very general, than to say something I should not.

As a pastor, I am bound to keep confidential what is confided to me, except in certain situations. (If you're interested in more information about what those situations are, please come talk to me.) However, I can't always tell if what you say to me is something you are confiding to me in private or if it is general information that is public knowledge. When and how you tell me can give me clues, but because I have to err on the side of caution and confidentiality, I will keep my mouth shut unless I know I don't have to.

Confidentiality is also important among the congregation as we actively "be the church" to one another. If someone trusts you enough to share their challenges with you (health or otherwise), keep that trust by only sharing if you are told it is OK to share with others, and that includes sharing the information with me as your and their pastor. While it's helpful for me to hear things that are truly public knowledge, but haven't made their way to me yet, it's also not appropriate to share private knowledge with me without permission.

Given all this, there are some helpful notes about how all of this connects to our prayer list and ministry:

When you share something with me, particularly if it relates to a health concern for you or a loved one, please let me know directly if this is public information or something that you wish me to keep in confidence.

Tell me directly if you want your name on the prayer list. I try to have express permission from those listed on our prayer list, especially as our list is included in our newsletter and names are often spoken aloud during worship which streams on Facebook.

Please understand there are many reasons why someone would choose not to be on the prayer list. This is one reason we pray for all experiencing health concerns in a general way.

Please do not assume that telling someone else in the congregation is the same as telling me.

If you are, or know you are going to be, hospitalized, please tell me directly, or have a family member do so. If you wish me to, I am happy to come visit you in the hospital, or come pray with you before an outpatient procedure, but I need to know that it is happening. If you do not want me to know, that is certainly up to you as well.

Pastoral confidentiality can become a dangerous and murky area if not handled carefully and well. If I am to gain and retain your trust, I need to be extremely careful what information I share. Thank you for your patience as I repeatedly ask if information can be shared. And when you ask how so-and-so is doing, please understand why often you will get only a very general answer.

I give thanks for the many ways we care for one another in body and spirit.

Church Council Meeting Minutes from April 16, 2024

St. Paul's Church Council Meeting....April 16, 2024

Those in attendance were: President Jeff Nelson, Crystal Corey, Rich Tucker, Ann Lubinski, LeAnn Jacobson, Jim Olson, and Diane Rislow. Absent: Pastor Tami

The meeting was called to order by President Jeff at 630pm with opening prayer read by Diane Rislow.

Motion made to approve the Secretary's report by Crystal and seconded by Diane. Motion carried. (special thank you for Diane Rislow for writing up the March minutes in Ann's absentance).

Dianne Rislow came to the meeting to discuss Food For Families sponsorship in May, 2024. Crystal motioned to accept the opportunity for our church to sponsor May 22, 2024 dinner in St. Charles at the Community Center. We are asked to provide the meal and donate \$300.00 cash for the bagged grocery items given to those who attend. The event serves from 4pm to 530pm and is open to all. We would need 6 to 8 church volunteers as well. Dianne Rislow will chair the group and ask for volunteers. There will be a free will offering basket set out for our members to donate towards the mission meal. The motion was 2nd and approved. If anyone is interested to attend the April 24th meal are encouraged to attend at 4pm. Dianne has been in contact with the Lewiston Moravian Church for there interest as well. A suggested meal was to have sloppy joe, chips, pickles, salads and dessert. Dianne and her committee will decide on all of the details and report to the congregation.

Committee Reports:

MUTUAL MINISTRY - Jeff reported they have not had an opportunity to meet but will soon.

WORSHIP – met on April 10th and Pastor Tami has planned out the summer services by asking members for their input to the Sermon message. Ideas can be put in the offering plate or a separate basket during the next few weeks. The church is planning on the outdoor service to be delivered during Heartland Days, with or without special music. More information to follow in the church bulletin as we get closer to the date.

Graduation Recognition Sunday will be April 28th. There are 6 youth graduating. Sunday School Recognition Sunday will be May 12.

PROPERTY MANAGEMENT – working on a date to resurface the back parking lot for this spring or summer. Continuing to have some issues with the flickering of lights in the sanctuary. Jon and Rich will work together and find a contractor who could fix it. Current price given was \$19,250.00 via Horman Electric.

PARISH ED/SPY – Diane discussed the fundraisers the youth have done which were well received. Discussing the possibility of bringing back VBS and to possibly having a one day event. Confirmation student will wait to be confirmed until next year. The youth were instrumental in purchasing items for the Bury the Altar Campaign. The youth mission trip will be traveling to St. Louis this summer. The following Sunday upon their return, the youth will share their experiences on their trip. Senior Recognition will be April 28th. We have 6 graduating seniors. Fellowship time will be done by the S.P.Y. youth.

The S.P.Y. will be sponsoring a rummage sale to raise money for the trip on June 20th and 21st during Heartland Days. Asking for items from the congregation to donate.

CALL COMMITTEE: Will meet on April 17th to discuss the steps to take forward. The Fischer Grant Report – the ramp in the front of the church had the cement raised to help keep water from entering the basement. Final railings have been installed. Many thanks to those who helped with this project.

OUTREACH & EVANGELISM – Jim explained our church members helping at the Ruby's Pantry held once a month in St. Charles. The September backpack fundraiser will again be done by assisting with items to fill some backpacks for the students attending the Lewiston school system.

Discussion was given from President Jeff in regards to the newly formed Cardinal Foundation club which is to help the local school for field trips, speakers, etc. The club will be having a fundraiser on May 17th. The fish fry will be held at the Legion in Lewiston. Jeff also has raffle tickets if interested.

PASTORS REPORT: Pastor Tami was unable to attend but furnished us with her report. She will be on vacation on May 5th as well as the week prior. Also, plans on vacation on August 4th including August 11th.

She will continue with her Continuing Education through courses offered.

Working on a current member directory/contact information for the congregation.

One way St. Paul's has been reaching out to our greater community is by volunteering at Ruby's Pantry at Brookwood Park, 272 West First Street, in St. Charles on the second Thursday of each month between 4 – 5:30. The next event is May 9. Volunteers are asked to come whenever it is convenient for you anytime between 2:30 and 6 to help set up, load cars, or clean up. The donated food is set up in the parking lot where cars drive through with their trunk open stopping at at a designated point to have volunteers place the food in the trunk. From their website: Ruby's mission is to activate people in being alert to the needs of others and to be proactive in encouraging faith, showing friendship, and meeting the tangible needs of neighbors, friends, and strangers regardless of race, religion, or ethnicity. Ruby's Pantry is for ANYONE who eats! There is no income or residency requirement and Ruby's Pantry is for anyone looking to extend their monthly grocery budget. Each guest donates a \$25 donation and receives an abundance of grocery items. Ruby's Pantry is not government-funded and is a 501 C3. Each donation is used to cover operational costs like trucking, gas, and warehouse staff. All of the food is donated by corporate food donors making it possible to reach more families each month at locations across Minnesota, Wisconsin, North Dakota, and lowa.

St. Paul's is Sponsoring Food for Families



<u>Food for Families</u> is a community-based free food resource program and community meal that is available to all residents in our surrounding area. It has been based in St. Charles for many years and is sponsored and facilitated by local churches, service organizations as well as concerned citizens.

St. Paul's is sponsoring Food for Families on May 22 at St. Charles Community Center – City Hall. This is a one-month commitment per year, or, if we choose, we could partner with another church for an additional month.

The role of sponsoring churches is to make a cash donation to help with the cost of the food provided, supply 6 – 8 volunteers anytime between 3 and 6, and furnish a light dinner for those who come. Volunteers will help set up the tables, carry in food, help shoppers, and clean up. Other volunteers will set up the meal in the kitchen, greet our guests, and serve the food.

This allows us to help lift those among us who might be challenged to provide food for our families and provide a time to socialize with new friends and neighbors. We are all dependent on each other for our well-being.
